

Conducting Effective Performance Appraisals

Overview:

Organisations use a number of programs to attract and develop a productive, flexible and motivated workforce. In performance management, formal systems for managing motivation and performance include performance appraisals, career development, training, mentoring and coaching. Informally, managers deal with both high performing and low performing employees everyday.

Potentially the performance appraisal can contribute to improved job satisfaction, work quality, motivation and better overall employee retention.

By the conclusion of this course students will feel more confident in their ability to make the performance appraisal of their staff a transparent and fair experience.

This program will address the key aspects of managing workplace performance, both formal and informal.
