

Managing Learning at the Frontline

The Role Australia's Frontline Managers Play in Leading Learning

Seminar Synopsis

Reference to learning at work has become significantly broader in recent times, and yet evidence suggests that for many organisations learning at work, still, rather narrowly refers to attendance at training events. Despite this considered expansion, considerably less attention has been given to the role that managers play in aiding employee learning at work. Organisations need to consider how they might establish an effective and continuous learning culture, as well as the role managers will play in demonstrating a lead learning capability.

The purpose of this seminar is in the presentation of the data collected as part of this doctoral study conducted at the University of Melbourne. This research has looked at the extent to which, and the ways in which, managers at the frontline promote and facilitate learning at work.

Seminar Content

This research project has focussed on the activities managers at the frontline engage their employees in to help on workplace learning and employee / worker / individual learning.

The seminar will address:

- What changes have occurred in the fields of Human Resource Management (HRM) and Human Resource Development (HRD) towards affecting a shift regarding the responsibilities of employee learning to managers?
- How is the role of Australia's managers changing and what is the character of this change?
- What constitutes a site for learning and how can learning at work be better facilitated?
- What role do managers play in taking the lead for learning at work?

The study looked at the support for workplace learning provided by frontline managers. Specifically, the study addressed the role of the frontline manager in helping on-the-job learning and their contribution to learning leadership.

- Greater understanding of how organisations might recruit and develop frontline managers.
- Improve the capacity of frontline managers to engage with their employees / team members regarding learning.
